RefWorks is valuable to anyone who works with grants, manuscripts, academic papers, reprints, and many other types of documents.

- RefWorks is an entirely web-based program for gathering, managing, and utilizing citation information.
- Enter or capture information about books, journal articles, and other sources for use in various documents.
- RefWorks will create properly formatted bibliographies.
- Integrates with Microsoft Word.
- Capture citation information from a wide range of databases including PubMed, Academic Search Premier, OCLC FirstSearch, and many others.
- Send citation information from full-text articles to your RefWorks account.
- Or, vice-versa, connect to full-text from your RefWorks account
- RefWorks has scores of output styles - from APA to the American Journal of Agricultural Economics to Turabian.
- Toggle between 7 different languages.
- Access your references from anywhere - lab, library, office, or on the road.
- Well suited to collaboration.

EndNote and Reference Manager users will find that RefWorks has nearly identical features to those programs plus much more. RefWorks has the advantage of more easily facilitating collaboration. It is updated frequently and thoughtfully (there is no need to wait 2 years for a new version). Also, many users find RefWorks to be far more intuitive and easy to adopt.
